

Dear Friends,

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you this summer season. Every year in Honduras the transition between the intense dry season and the abundant rainy season brings stark contrasts. This year, however, brought even more new challenges, rarely seen before. As you may recall from email updates, May was filled with horrible air pollution, putting us in the "hazardous" air quality index category for many consecutive days, due to forest fires, pollution, lack of rain, and extreme heat. We reached above 90 degrees from March - to May, something very rare for Tegucigalpa, due to our high altitude.

In addition to the poor air conditions, the rain which normally begins during the first days of May didn't fall week after week after week. Sadly, for our students, families, and community members, the lack of rainwater also means a lack of running water in our homes. During the dry season, there were parts of La Era (and much of the entire city) that only got a few hours of running water every 15 - 30 days. This means that when the water does come, someone must be home to fill up every bottle, container, basin, and reservoir that exists in the home.

How does a community survive with such little water, you may ask? Hondurans in poor communities like La Era have learned to become experts at saving and recycling every drop of water, washing dishes and clothes with as little water as possible, and taking fast bucket showers.

In Honduras, it continues to be an injustice, decade after decade, that the poorest communities get the least water.

Thanks to the support of generous partners like you, Jubilee was extremely blessed to be able to drill a 300-foot well that supplies every toilet, sink, and washing basin with water that never runs out. Reminding us once again of His faithfulness and provision to Jubilee, "He will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never run dry." (Isaiah 58:11)



We ask for your prayers and ongoing support as our students and families continue to learn, grow, and thrive despite often difficult and adverse circumstances.



The Athletes for Christ After-School Sports Program began in 2023, now in its second year, we have over 60 students participating in both soccer and handball! A key highlight of this program is the integration of parents, coaches, and kids, which helps to foster a supportive environment for our students. The program offers specific disciplines for both girls and boys: until now, handball for girls and soccer for boys. These sports not only promote physical activity but also have an evangelistic purpose emphasizing Christian values and representing Christ on and off the field.

Handball, in particular, has been a great sport for our girls to begin to get in the game, allowing them to get to know each other better and enjoy a sport that fosters unity, teamwork, and strategy.

In the case of soccer, we are very happy because the boys have started competing with other schools which continues to help them to develop their skills and character. It has been demonstrated how they stand out from others through their disciplined behavior and their focus on supporting their teammates rather than winning at all costs. On one occasion, the coach of another team asked Jubilee's coach, "What do you do to make your kids so disciplined and respectful?" All the glory be to God!

Soccer players in 9th and 10th grades, Rony and Dominich, had behavioral issues. Through Athletes for Christ and the discipline it instills, they have become better students academically, are more humble, and dedicated to the Lord.

At just 28 years old, she has a story of faith, perseverance, and unwavering love and has been an integral part of our community since 2019. Ms. Urbina's teaching degrees have allowed her to teach at both the elementary, middle, and high school levels. During her first 4 years at Jubilee, Ms. Urbina taught 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades.

This year, she has enjoyed the new challenge of teaching Social Studies (including Sociology and Philosophy) to our 7th - 11th graders.

Ms. Urbina's journey has been filled with challenges and adversities. From a young age, she has felt the Lord's mercy in her life, guiding her steps and providing strength during difficult times. Hailing from a small rural town in southern Honduras, Ms. Urbina faced significant obstacles in pursuing higher education.

"Since I was a little girl, I went with my mom to church," said Ms. Urbina who also shares the testimony of her brother Ulices who suffered from epilepsy for many years. The doctors told her mom that if they didn't operate on Ulices, he would die.

In the middle of the night, Ms. Urbina's mother would always pray over her three children, but this night, completely desperate and without the finances to have the operation, Ms. Urbina's mother cried out to God in great anguish, begging for a miracle. Ulices, at 6 years of age, woke up and told his mom that Jesus told him that he was healed and that they should go to sleep. The next day his mother took him to get tests done and the doctor confirmed that he had no signs of epilepsy anymore and from that day on, Ulices was healed, glory be to God!

As we approach a joyous milestone in Ms. Urbina's life—her upcoming wedding in December—we rejoice with her and celebrate this new chapter. We are grateful to have a teacher so deeply committed to God, who has witnessed His glory so profoundly in her life.
