We also look forward to many year-end graduations like that of our Kindergarteners, our Middle Schoolers (9th graders in Honduras) and our very first class of High School graduates!



It is extremely rewarding to see the vision of a PreK - High School become a reality, during this 15th anniversary year. In Honduras, our High School track (Humanities) graduates students in 11th grade with a completed high school diploma and everything needed to go on to study at the University. In fact, many of our 11th graders recently took the Public University entrance exam and are eagerly awaiting their results.

Just over a month ago we celebrated Jubilee's 15th Anniversary with our 375 students and over 40 staff members. Our new chapel was very full and we were also "Filled with joy!" 

Aylin is in 3rd grade, lives in La Era- and has been a student at Jubilee for 5 years. She says, "I really like this school. I enjoy the devotionals and the church services on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays." Her favorite verse from the Bible is Psalm 121:5, which says, "The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand." Aylin finds comfort in this verse and often writes about her thoughts and prayers in her prayer journal.

She worries deeply about people who might not come to know Christ, especially her family members who don't yet believe in God. Her greatest desire is to go to heaven and meet Jesus. Winners with humble hearts: SCIENCE AND TECNOLOGY FAIR 2024

We are so proud of our students who went on to compete at the District Level Science Fair Competition. Each one of Jubilee's projects received 1st, 2nd or 3rd place as they competed against peer groups from 16 other schools. This year all of our projects included the new innovative theme of Robotics. With the help of our Science and Technology teachers, the students learned how to integrate robotics into their creative projects! In addition to the winners listed below, Jubilee won second place for both the 6th-grade team's Arduino crane model, and the 9th-grade team's smart sensor trash can.

The Solar Puppy

The solar puppy is assembled like a puzzle, which supports the cognition of these young minds and allows them to discover how solar energy works, another viable alternative for reducing environmental impact.

This cane enables people with limited vision to hear and feel their surroundings; when it strikes a surface, it emits a sound and vibration, thanks to its Arduino system, assembled by the students themselves.
